We are delighted that, in May, Ofsted rated the school as 'Good' in all areas and stated that 'pupils are happy and feel safe'. The children then presented their argument clearly to the judge.

Through the activity the children were able to develop the following skills:

- Producing persuasive arguments
- Expressing their views and wishes
- Standing up for their rights
- Confidence
- Teamwork
- Using and developing their oracy skills.

The children also gained knowledge of the legal profession and we hope that taking part has inspired our Year 1 children to be future solicitors, lawyers and judges in the making!

Statutory Assessment Results

Congratulations to the children of James Cambell on their amazing progress across the whole school from Reception to year 6.

The table below shows the results and a comparison with the national average. This shows that the children here beat the national average in almost every area!
